It is also pertinent to mention that due to the sincere efforts of all the officers and staff of this Department, the Administrative Departments and all the PSUs of the state, the performance of the state PSUs are improving.

<u>CHAPTER –</u> I

Organisation of the Department & its Functions

1.1 Rules of Business:

Department of Public Enterprises (DPE) has been incorporated on 4th January 1991 to oversee and regulate the functioning of the State Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs). The Department of Public Enterprises is headed by a Cabinet Minister and the Secretariat is headed by a Principal Secretary to the Government of Odisha who is assisted by Joint Secretary , Deputy Director (Technical), AFA-Cum- Deputy Director, two Under Secretaries, and other Ministerial staff. It is the 'Nodal Department' for the State PSUs with total staff strength of 43 against the sanctioned strength of 53 and is one of the leanest Departments of the Government.

The Odisha State Renewal Fund Society (OSRFS) a society registered under Societies Registration Act 1960 was set up in 2009 under the administrative control of the Department of Public Enterprises to facilitate Public Sector Reform programme for the state PSUs.

The following activities are entrusted to this Department as per the Rules of Business.

- 1. Laying down general policy and guidelines for effective management, marketing, finance, and services etc. of Public Sector Undertakings and periodic review of their performance.
- 2. Regulating Industrial Project Proposals through the Project Approval Committee.
- Prescribing norms for financial discipline, budgeting, accounting and audit in the Public Sector Undertakings.
- 4. Eliciting information and data from Public Sector Undertakings and advising on preventive measures against their becoming sick.
- 5. Prescribing norms for mutual co-operation and co-ordination among the Public Sector Undertakings.
- 6. Prescribing Model Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) and reviewing the progress of MoUs.

Additional Responsibilities

- 1. Implementation of decisions of the Government relating to sale/ privatization/ divestment of the identified State PSUs and cooperative enterprises.
- 2. Assistance to State PSUs including Cooperative Enterprises in implementing their VR Schemes.
- 3. This Department is implementing and overseeing the public enterprise reform programme of the Government through OSRFS and implementing Social Safety Net Programme (SSNP) for the voluntarily separated employees of the State PSUs.
- 4. Selection of Professionals for the top Managerial Posts like Directors including Managing Directors for the PSUs of the State through Public Enterprises Selection Board(PESB) when requested by the concerned PSUs/ Board through their Administrative Department.
- 5. Implementation of Corporate Governance Manual for State PSUs for their smooth functioning.


1.2 Management of the Department:

The Department of Public Enterprises oversees the functions of the State Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) and advises on their efficient management and control in the functional areas, such as finance, production, organization and marketing.

The department has been using computer systems in its office operation. In order to broad base the system NIC NET connection has been installed in the Department through NIC (ER), Bhubaneswar.

1.3 Budget Allocation

Government of Odisha have allocated the required funds to this Department under two heads of expenditure, viz.3451-Secretariat Economic Services (Non-Plan) and 2235-Social Security & Welfare – (State Plan).

The details of Budget provision and expenditure against each Major Head during the FY 2012-13 are given below.

DPE is providing financial assistance to the State PSUs including cooperative enterprises to implement their VR /VS/ Closure Compensation Scheme as per the approved VRS/VSS Schemes.

CHAPTER –II Performance of the Department of Public Enterprises

Department of Public Enterprises, being the Nodal Department for the State PSUs, has discharged its activities as per the Rules of Business. The major activities during the FY2012-13 were as follows:

2.1 Finalization of Audit & Accounts

Government of India, successive Finance Commissions and statutory authorities are emphasizing for timely compilation and finalization of audit of accounts of State PSUs. Keeping in view of their concerns, DPE has conducted review meetings in association with the Accountant General (Cost Works and Receipt Audit), Odisha, Bhubaneswar with the Chief Executives and senior officials of the PSUs to liquidate the arrear accounts of the working PSUs within a definite time frame.

2.2 Approval of Project Investment Proposal

Capital investment decisions are very crucial on the part of the State PSUs as well as Government. Government in DPE has framed policy to monitor the investment proposals of the State PSUs and beyond a threshold limit and the same is placed before the Project Approval Committee (PAC) headed by the Chief Secretary, Odisha. Two meetings of the Project Approval Committee (PAC) meetings have been held during 2012-13.

2.3 Disbursement of financial assistance to the State PSUs and cooperative enterprises for implementation of VRS

DPE provided financial assistance for implementation of VRS in the State PSUs and cooperative enterprises. In FY **2012-13**, Rs. 12.14 Crore of financial assistance has been provided for 240 employees of State PSUs and cooperative enterprises.

2.4 Issue of Circulars / Office memorandum / Resolutions

In line with the activities envisaged in the Rules of Business, the Department has issued number of Resolutions on various issues from time to time. Detail of the circulars, guidelines, office Memorandums and Resolutions issued during FY2012-13 are at Annexure- A, B C & D.

<u>CHAPTER –III</u> Performance of the PSUs

Public sector is an essential and vibrant element in building-up of India's economy. Public enterprises have played an important role in achieving the objective of economic growth with social justice. The State Government, in order to fulfill the objectives, has set-up public enterprises to harness local resources of the State and thereby to create employment opportunities. They have been working for the development of the State in many ways. However, the State Government is making an endeavor to offer quality service to the people through the Public Sector Enterprises. The State Government, in the recent past devised a system of Memorandum of Understanding to monitor and measure performance among state PSUs.

The Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) consist of state Government companies and statutory corporations. The state PSUs are established to carry out activities of commercial nature keeping in view the welfare of the people of Odisha. The working state PSUs registered a turnover of Rs.14,99,059.07 lakh for the year 2012-13 and earned a profit of Rs.1,53,007.19 lakh in aggregate during 2012-13 as per their latest finalized accounts.

3.1 Investment

As on 31st March 2013, the investment (paid up capital and loans) in 32 PSUs is Rs.9,05,274.42 Lakh (paid up Capital Rs.2,33,490.25 Lakh and loan Rs.6,71,784.17 lakh) in toto.

3.2 Profit & Loss

Out of 32 working PSUs, 27 PSUs have earned profit, 4 PSUs have sustained loss and Odisha State Civil Supplies Corporation Ltd. is running on no Profit and no Loss basis. PSUs earning profit/ incurring loss during the financial years, 2012-13 are follows.

3.4 Dividend Paid by State PSUs

Payment of dividend by any State Enterprise is one of the prime indicators of its sound financial performance. However, only 9(nine) State PSUs had paid dividend to the State Government (from 2008-09 to 2012-13) as is evident below.

CHAPTER-IV Odisha Public Enterprise Reform Programme

4.1 Back ground: The Government of Odisha initiated public and co-operative enterprises reform in mid-1999 with technical and financial assistance from DFID. A "White Paper on Public Enterprise Reform" presented before the Odisha Legislative Assembly in April 2002, highlighting the need for reforms in public enterprises. DFID supported two phases of reform and the second phase concluded in 2008.

The first two phases of the program focused on

- Achieving fiscal sustainability by containing outflow of the state's budgetary resources in the nonperforming public enterprises
- Right sizing of organizations through VRS/VSS
- Devise reform strategy for PSUs and cooperative enterprises and identify entities for reform, closure and privatization
- Financial assistance for skill up gradation of separated employees through Social Safety Net Programme (SSNP) to provide alternative means of livelihood

4.2 ODISHA STATE RENEWAL FUND SOCIETY (OSRFS)

(a) Back ground

Considering the benefits of the reform and to continue the ongoing programs, the State Government was pleased to set up the Odisha State Renewal Fund Society (OSRFS) under the Administrative Control of Public Enterprise Department with fund support from state government budget and DFID.

(b) **Objectives**

The broad objectives of the Odisha State Renewal Fund Society (OSRFS) include the following:-

- i. Assist DPE in planning, implementing & monitoring the PSU reforms program
- ii. Build on benefits already achieved in phases I & II of OPERP
- iii. Support GoO initiative for adoption of corporate governance measures & practices in all State PSUs
- iv. Ensure continuation of the Social Safety Net Program (SSNP) so that the reforms program does not lose its human face
- v. Advice and support state PSUs on restructuring, privatization or closure as decided by the Government

(c) Tenure

The tenure of the OSRFS is up to 31st March 2014 and may be continued, if Government of Odisha so desires.

4.3 Financial assistance to State Public & Cooperative Enterprises to implement their Voluntary Retirement / Voluntary Separation Scheme

Rightsizing of the workforce in state public enterprises is a key initiative for restructuring of the state's public sector enterprises. This has helped to reduce the manpower cost with voluntary separation of the employees. The <u>Voluntary Retirement Scheme (VRS)</u> and <u>Voluntary Separation Scheme (VSS)</u> of the Government of Odisha for public sector employees are administered by the concerned PSUs for which

financial assistance is provided by the Department of Public Enterprises as per the model VRS/VSS scheme.

4.4 Social Safety Net Programme:

The Social Safety Net Programme (SSNP) provides a human face to the public sector reform program of Department of Public Enterprises and is implemented by Odisha State Renewal Fund Society (OSRFS). The primary objective of the program is to counsel the voluntary retirees to overcome the trauma of job loss and prepare them for alternative livelihood.

The SSNP program also provides assistance to the retirees on skill enhancement, scheme linkages for financial assistance, exposure visits etc. to enable them to improve their level of income. The achievements during the year 2012-13 are given below:

4.5 <u>Technical support and assistance to public enterprises:</u>

OSRFS provided technical assistance and support on various policy initiatives to DPE and reform interventions to state PSUs as detailed below;

- Assistance to PSUs and Administrative Departments in preparation and signing of MOU for performance monitoring of state PSUs for the year 2012-13
- Assist in development of policy guidelines for investment of surplus funds by state PSUs
- Develop concept notes on Campus recruitment, instituting awards for best performing PSUs, Permanent Arbitration mechanism for resolution of commercial disputes among PSUs and with Administrative Department
- Assisted 6 PSUs in study of business process and process reengineering for computerization of accounting and inventory management system along with estimation of hardware and software requirements.
- Conduct workshop for top management of state PSUs to sensitize on capability of MIS system in a computerizes environment and advantage in decision making process
- Assisted in restructuring of organization structure and manpower planning based on business requirements for Police Housing and Welfare Corporation and Odisha State Beverage Corporation is in progress.
- PSUs with social mandate OSRTC and OPDC is studied and development of business optimization plan is in progress to improve operational and financial sustainability
- Strategic business planning through medium term business plan for Odisha State Warehousing corporation is in progress

Sanction of D.A. @ 7% with effect from 01/01/2012 in favour of the Employees of Sub: the State Public Sector Undertakings on the Revised Scales of Pay, 2008.

Finance Department in their Office Memorandum No. 15809/F, dated 09.04.2012 have allowed Dearness Allowance @ 7% to the State Government employees on the revised scale of pay and grade pay with effect from 01.01.2012. Consequent upon revision of the scales of pay as per ORSP Rules, 2008 for the employees of the State PSUs vide Public Enterprises Resolution No. 1386/PE, dt. 08.05.2009, Government after careful consideration have decided that the Dearness Allowance @ 7% raising from 58% to 65% to the employees of State PSUs on the revised scale of pay and grade pay with effect from 01.01.2012.

This additional dose of DA shall be sanctioned in favour of the employees of State PSUs, who satisfies the following entitlement criteria on case-to-case basis:

- Completion of statutory audit at least up to FY 2010-11. i)
- ii) The PSUs should not have defaulted in repayment of loan to any Bank/ Financial Institution or to the State Government.
- iii) Should not have defaulted in payment of statutory dues of employees such as Provident Fund & ESI.
- iv) Should not be in receipt of any budgetary grant or subsidy for partly or fully covering its administrative/ establishment expenses.
- V) Should have adequate internal resources and bear the additional financial burden arising out of the enhance dose of D.A. from its own sources.
- vi) Submission of Board approved MoU for the FY 2012-13 and signing of MoU with the Administrative Department.
- vii) Should ensure appointment of Independent Directors in their Board, as per requirement of Corporate Governance Manual

The PSU which fulfill the above requirements and coming under the categorization frame work will send proposals direct to their Administrative Department for necessary sanction after due approval of their Board of Directors. For other PSUs they will send the proposals to P.E. Department through their Administrative Department after due approval of their Board of Directors. The Department of Public Enterprises, after examining the proposals on case-to-case basis will consider to release the enhanced D.A. to the PSUs.
